



TIMELINE SEMANA SANTA



01.

Palm Sunday or Domingo de Ramos

This Sunday marks Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, where crowds welcomed him with palm branches as a sign of honor and devotion. This marks the start of Semana Santa (Holy Week) and the end of Lent.

People carry palm leaves or olive branches, symbolizing peace, welcome, and devotion.



02.

Holy Monday or Lunes Santo

Holy Monday is often linked to Mary anointing Jesus with expensive perfume in Bethany, a powerful act of love and devotion before the Passion.

Some traditions also connect Monday with Jesus cleansing the Temple, symbolizing purity and the rejection of corruption.



03.

Holy Tuesday or Martes Santo

On this day Jesus begins speaking more openly about what is coming, telling his disciples that one of them will betray him, and Peter (one of his closest followers) will deny knowing him.

Holy Tuesday is filled with warning, heartbreak, and the growing sense that the story is moving toward something much bigger

05.

Holy Thursday or Jueves Santo

Holy Thursday (Jueves Santo) is when Jesus shares the Last Supper with his disciples, washes their feet as a lesson in love, and prays in the Garden.

This is the day the action really picks up.

Judas leaves to betray him, setting the stage for the events that follow.



04.

Holy Wednesday or Miércoles Santo

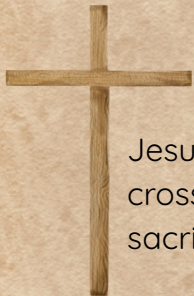
Jesus confirms that Judas will betray him. Judas then goes to the chief priests and agrees to hand Jesus over in exchange for money, traditionally 30 pieces of silver. His decision sets the rest of the Passion into motion.

06.

Good Friday or Viernes Santo

Jesus is arrested, put on trial, and sentenced to be crucified. He carries his cross to Golgotha, where he is nailed to it and dies. People remember his sacrifice, his courage, and the love he showed even in his hardest moments.

This the saddest day of Holy Week, and people honor this day with solemn processions and reflection.



07.

Holy Saturday or Sábado Santo

Today is a day of waiting and reflection. Jesus rests in the tomb.

08.

Easter Sunday or Domingo de Pascua

Jesus rises from the dead, bringing joy, hope, and new beginnings.

This is the happiest day of Holy Week! The streets fill with music, flowers, and celebration as everyone rejoices in the Resurrection.
